



GUIDANCE DOCUMENT NVL NEW TEAM APPLICATION 2026-27

INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the guidance document to help you to complete the <u>NVL New Team</u>
<u>Application for 2026-27</u>

This is a very competitive process, with continued demand for entry into the NVL. The 26-27 season there will be a minimum of four available places in the Men's and Women's competitions to reach the structure of 84 teams.

Volleyball England aims to guide teams through this process and offer help and support where it is requested.

Please take time to complete the below application.

The report needs to be completed as part of the team's application into the league (NVL Regulations A.6 & 7) by 31st March 2026, and no late applications will be considered.

The Application encompasses four key elements:

People – The team conduct, coach, referees and team administration. **Performance** – Team performance, player support, and development. **Match day experience** – Venue and facilities standards and fan experience. **Club Sustainability** – Basic clubs standards, volunteer sustainability and growth of future talent.

At the end of each element is an open comment box for you to provide comments or feedback on your answer.

Please note that the application needs to be completed for each team that wants to enter the NVL.

SECTION ONE: TEAM DETAILS

1. Club Name

Please note that the club must have been affiliated with VE for the last two seasons to gain entry to the league.

2. The name of the team you are applying to enter the NVL.

Please type the name of the team you are applying to into the NVL, this needs to be completed individually for each team you are entering if you wish to enter multiple teams.

A team's name must:

- Permit easy geographical recognition of where they are from / play
- Is unique in the NVL

Volleyball England will use this to clarify any information with you throughout the application process.

SECTION TWO: PEOPLE -

The team conduct, coach, referees, and team administration.

Rational:

- To demonstrate a support team made up of a variety of people to provide seamless team functionality, increasing the standard of the teams.
- To demonstrate the team has qualified and registered people to raise standards.
- To demonstrate support from your current Regional or Area Association.

The Form of Support will ask the Region / Area Association about the Teams: Admin levels, Team Conduct, History of the Team, Teams Performance, and any other information that may be relevant to the application.

9. Do you have additional **non-playing** people to ensure your team is effective and able to operate at an NVL level?

Please specify all the different people and roles they will be undertaking.

Example roles could include; Assistant Coach, Team Manager, Statistician, Team Secretary, Secondary Team Contact, Social Media Secretary.

Not all roles listed in the example are required, however please give as much detail in this section as you can. It is encouraged that where possible teams have a varied people structure opposed to the same people doing multiple roles.

The Assistant Coach must hold an Assistant Coach Award (Level 1) and be registered as a coach in VolleyZone for the current season to be able to be selected as an Assistant Coach.

10. Please select the most applicable sentence which describes your team's referee staff.

A: The Team has a **minimum of one registered referee** (s) who is of a minimum **grade 3N** who is **not currently refereeing in the National League** but prepared to do so for a **minimum of three games** in the season.

B: The Team has a **minimum of one registered referee** (s) who is of a minimum **grade 3R** who is **not currently refereeing in the National League** but prepared to do so for a **minimum of three games** in the season.

C: The Team has a **minimum of one registered referee** (s) who is of a minimum **grade 4** who is **not currently refereeing in the National League** but prepared to be observed to a 3R and referee in the National League for a **minimum of three games** in the season.

D: The Team has **no qualified referees** at current however has people who would be willing to take a referee course, if this application is successful.

Please note that if you have a referee who is currently officiating in the NVL, this will not count.

A: At **every match** this season (both home and away) we have had a qualified matchday Head Coach who has both a Club Coach Award (Level 2) (or is registered on a Club Coach Award course), and an active coach registration on VolleyZone for the current season.

B: **We mostly** (50% of matches) have a qualified matchday Head Coach who has both a Club Coach Award (Level 2) (or is registered on a Club Coach Award course), and an active coach registration on VolleyZone for the current season.

C: We **do not have** a **have** a matchday Head Coach who has both a Club Coach Award (Level 2) (or are registered on a Club Coach Award course), and an active coach registration for the season.

If you do not have a qualified Coach with a Club Coach Award (Level 2) within your team or across your club, bookings for the next Club Coach Award Course are now open. This is a great opportunity ahead of the 2026-27 season for your team to ensure that you can always have a matchday Head Coach who is appropriately qualified.

Please note that Assistant Coaches are unable to resume the role of matchday Head Coach.

Rational

- The past and current performance of team and their aspirations for the 26-27 season.
- A regular training environment supplemented by additional support services.
- A sustainable group of players retained and recruited.

SECTION FOUR: MATCH DAY EXPERIENCE - Venue and facilities standards and fan experience

Rational:

- A facility that is available and equipped with the NVL specifications to host matches in a safe professional environment.
- Team engagement with local community, and a good spectator experience for matches increasing the exposure of Volleyball and increasing standards.

- A: The team can host four to five triangulars in the season.

Volleyball England expects teams to be able to host triangular matches at their home venue throughout the season. It is rare that a team will be asked to host more than four triangulars within a season.

Each triangular requires a seven-hour hall booking.

Court Equipment

- Base Protection- If the posts have anchor points, then base protection is required to ensure all components of the base are entirely covered.

Please note that Post Padding and Base Protection is COMPULSORY at ALL NVL matches, regardless of division and if a team wants to enter the league, then they must have (or have on order) both Post Padding AND Base Protection (if required)

SECTION FIVE: CLUB SUSTAINABILITY- Basic club standards, volunteer sustainability and growth of future talent.

Rationale - The team exists within a strong club foundation that considers the wider committee, finances and a club structure.

36. What way can you demonstrate you have a pool of players available to be fed into the team?

The focus of this question is to determine whether your team is sustainable year on year and able to cope with losing players (for example injuries and players leaving).

For example, the team has a development pathway through the club teams/squads or an annual try-out and recruitment activity, rather than a reactive/last-minute raid of the Junior or recreation sections of the club.

The fees for the 2025-26 season were as follows. Please note these will be subject to change. **League Entry Fee for Division 3 teams** -£318 (due upon acceptance of entry). **Player Registration Fee** – Seniors £44.50 or Juniors (U18) £29. **Transfer Fee** -£27 (for players registered for another NVL team in the last 2 years).

You will be notified if your application has been successful or not by May 2026.
